Principal Report



Professional Learning

Staff have participated in professional learning about trauma informed practice and its impact on education and relationships, strategies for dealing with demanding parents and further lesson modelling on numeracy.

Staff Development Day

Staff will be learning about Quicksmart numeracy intervention, accreditation with NESAs, Disabilities Standards for Education, numeracy planning as well as iPad integration in the classroom. Staff have elected to work until 6pm in lieu of the first part of Friday 20 December. This has been reported through the newsletter.

Staffing

Next term we welcome Mrs Melanie Gebbard a permanent appointment as part of the Graduate Recruitment Program. She replaces Miss Samantha Ridge teaching 3/4S.

Special Interest Groups

To encourage school engagement the Special Interest Groups will commence in Term 2 on alternate weeks to assembly (odd weeks). Students have chosen from the following activities: dance, drumming, gardening, cartooning, green screen movie making, tie dying, lego construction, craft, knitting, cooking, robotics and sewing.

NAPLAN

Students in Year 3 and 5 have participated in practice online NAPLAN in preparation for the assessments next term. This is the first mandatory year for all schools to conduct the tests online and this should provide more time efficient feedback to schools and parents regarding their child's progress.



Maintenance and Infrastructure

Electronic Sign - I have received notification that the electronic school sign and the school fence aligning Tuggerah Street will be moved as part of the roadworks. This is likely to occur during the school holidays. Due to the numerous issues experienced since installation a new school sign will be installed.

Play Equipment –The bridge and monkey bars will be installed in the second week of the holidays. The quote for the replacement rubber has been approved and will occur after the Country Fair due to the time frame.

Sensory Garden – I am still awaiting an opportunity to meet with Ian Stott Head Teacher Horticulture from TAFE regarding the wall.

Tree Audit - I have requested council return for further branch removal along the Stage 2 and 3 classrooms after another branch fell which could've caused a concern for student safety. Please note this area has been blocked off since the previous branch fell.

Share Our Space - Taking into consideration the roadworks and upgrades to the play equipment it was decided that the school would not participate again in the Share our Space initiative by opening the school playgrounds to the public. This may occur again in the future once improvements have been finalised.





ANZAC Parade

All students and are encouraged to march as part of our school group in the ANZAC parade along the Pacific Highway. Students are asked to arrive at Yates Rd Ourimbah at 1pm in full school uniform. This is an earlier time than in previous years which is a change requested from the police. The march will commence at 1.30pm and will conclude with the ceremony at Ourimbah Public School.

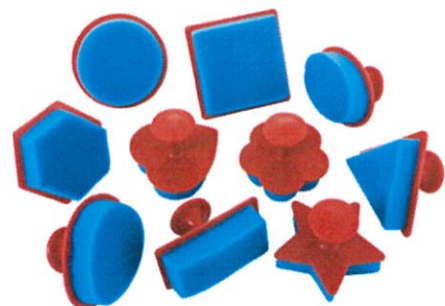

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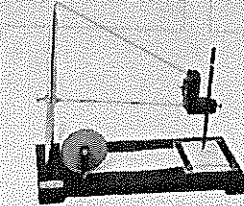
FRACTURES, FAULTS & DISLOCATION MODEL

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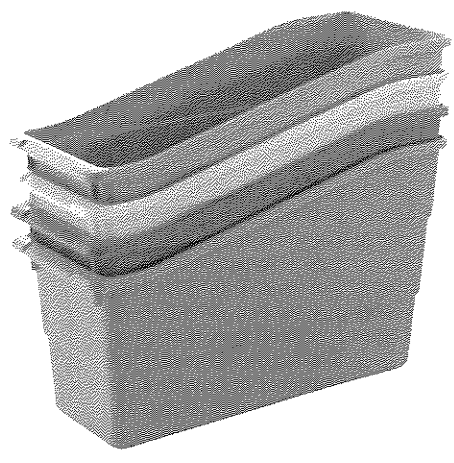
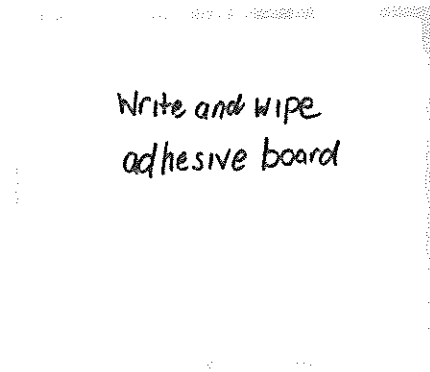
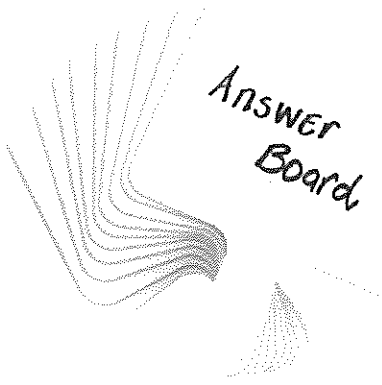
